Belém

You can visit the stunning Belém Tower and the Jerónimos Monastery with its intricate Manueline architecture – both classified as World Heritage sites by UNESCO –, and the Monument to the Discoveries, which celebrates Portugal's Age of Exploration.



Alfama

Alfama is Lisbon's oldest neighborhood and is known for its narrow, winding streets, colorful buildings, and Fado music. Explore the São Jorge Castle for panoramic views of the city, and wander through the charming streets to discover hidden cafes and shops.



Baixa

Baixa is the heart of Lisbon, known for its grand squares and elegant streets. Don't miss Praça do Comércio, one of Europe's largest squares, and the historic Elevador de Santa Justa, a beautiful wrought-iron elevator offering panoramic views.



Chiado
